Curt Bailey to Begin Leading Bloodworks June 2019

Seattle, WA – Bloodworks Northwest’s Board of Trustees has announced the appointment of Curt Bailey, MBA, as Bloodwork’s president and CEO, succeeding James P. AuBuchon, MD who served in the position for 11 years. Curt Bailey, a leading expert in healthcare transformation, will begin his duties June 3, 2019, following Dr. AuBuchon’s retirement May 3, 2019.

Mr. Bailey joins Bloodworks after 20 years in healthcare management consulting, most recently working for McKinsey & Company where he served as a Seattle-based Partner in the firm’s healthcare practice. Bailey has advised a variety of healthcare companies across the U.S. with an emphasis on serving non-profit, community-based and academic healthcare institutions. He is a recognized expert and thought leader in strategy, operational improvement, and organizational health and has been published in leading journals, including *Harvard Business Review*. Prior to joining McKinsey, Bailey was a helicopter

pilot and captain in the United States Marine Corp. He earned his MBA from Yale University and BA from Tufts University.

"I'm excited to lead this incredible organization with significant depth of medical knowledge and a long history of scientific breakthroughs that have a far-reaching impact on the lives of patients, families and communities locally and around the world," said Bailey.
